The GPRRA committees:

Management Committee - monitors municipal policies and affairs to evaluate them according to the highest principles of good local governance and influence the City to adopt policies, frame regulations and make decisions acceptable to members.

Built Environment Committee - ensures minimum destruction of our built heritage and maximum public open space and off street parking. Our built heritage and characteristic environment can never be replaced once it has been destroyed.

Events Committee – liaises with event organizers to maintain a sustainable balance between events held on the common and the effects of noise, pollution and traffic which encroaches on the lives of residents.

Human Environment Committee – initiates social programs and shares recommendations by field workers relating to the homeless; fundraises for IDs and other upliftment initiatives; supported by EPWP teams assigned by Social Development maintains public gardens; speaks to residents to buy into recycling and managing bins.
